4. Final year students of Graduate Courses (10+2+3) whose result will be declared before commencement of admission for next academic year can also apply.

6. Actual Paper – Order of Sections & Jumping between sections

1. Test takers can move back and forth between the four sections and answer in any order of their preference, there is no sectional time limit.
2. There is no negative marking for leaving a question unanswered; however, an incorrect response would call for a negative scoring.
3. Each candidate will be given a desk with a computer terminal along with a plain paper and pen/pencil for rough calculations.
4. No breaks are allowed during the test.

5. Candidates will not be allowed to use any other paper or sheet apart from the scratch paper provided by the conducting bodies. Only the CMAT admit card 2019 is allowed inside the CMAT exam centres 2019.
6. Test takers are not permitted to carry the scratch paper outside the centre and are advised to keep the same at the desk once they complete their examination.
7. Calculators are not allowed and No Online Calculators.
8. Candidates are NOT allowed to carry Instrument/ Geometry/ Pencil box, Handbag, Purse, Any kind of Paper/ Stationery/ Textual material (printed or written material), Eatables and Water (loose or packed), Mobile Phone/ Ear Phone/ Microphone/ Pager, Calculator, Camera, Tape Recorder, any metallic item or electronic gadgets etc. in the examination Room/ Hall.
