2. MAH CET 2019 aspirant must be a graduate with a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate or equivalent from a recognized university.
3. Final year graduates are also eligible to apply.
4. For reserved category candidates, the minimum marks requirement is 45%.
5. Candidates appearing for CAT/GMAT/CMAT/MAT February/XAT/ATMA are eligible for MAH CET counselling under the All India Seats subject to fulfilment of eligibility criteria.
